GENERAL SHOW

REGULATIONS

The Society's General Show Regulations and Section Conditions regulate the conduct of the Show. Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by those General Show Regulations and Section Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or from the website <http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations>.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Section Condition may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

The Society may publish to:

- a) all Royal Show Societies in Australia;
- b) the relevant Breed Society; and
- c) the body with which the exhibit is registered, or is eligible for registration,

the result of any proceedings before the Disciplinary Committee in which a person has been found to have breached any General Show Regulation or Section Condition.

The Society may recognise and act upon any penalty imposed by any other similar society, organisation, or body in Australia on any person or exhibit. It is in the Exhibitors best interests to carefully read all conditions.

INSURANCE

The Owner/Exhibitor is responsible for the insurance of their exhibit whilst the exhibit is on the Society's Showground.

DAMAGES

The Owner/Exhibitor shall be liable to reimburse the Society for any damages, costs, claims, expenses, or liabilities incurred, or likely to be incurred, by the Society arising from the withdrawal of an exhibit.

WITHDRAWAL OF EXHIBIT BY THE SOCIETY

The Society may, at its sole discretion, withdraw, reject or disqualify an exhibit. Refer to the Society's General Show Regulation 3.18.

DANGEROUS, OBJECTIONABLE OR DISEASED EXHIBITS

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the Society's General Show Regulation 4.7 and 4.8, with reference to dangerous, objectionable, or diseased exhibits

PRIZE MONEY

RASWA has a policy whereby all prize money is paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Your banking details will be kept secure and can only be used by RASWA to credit your bank account. Please complete your account details on the entry form even if you have provided them previously. In accordance with the rules of the competition, failure to provide your bank details will mean that any prize money you earn will be forfeited and retained by RASWA.

Prize money as stated in the schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Exhibitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN) the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice (RCTI) within 28 days of the day you were successful at your event, detailing the GST which you will need to submit to the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

If any adjustments need to be made, the Society will issue an adjustment note to you within 28 days of the adjustment. Upon entry into the competition and completion and signing of the application form, this form will become a RCTI agreement as required under (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- The Society will issue you a tax invoice in respect of the successful exhibit;
- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect to prize money received;
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST; and
- The Society will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of the determinations.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the prize schedule.

If you are a business Exhibitor and do not provide your ABN to the Society, 47% tax will be deducted from your prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the prize schedule.

AWARDS

The Society will not be responsible for awards or prize money not received by Exhibitors after 31 December 2024. If you have not received your award(s) or prize money by 30 November 2024, please contact RASWA on (08) 6263 3100.

SOCIETY'S LIABILITY

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

All personnel engaged by the Royal Agricultural Society of WA (RASWA) are bound by RASWA's Social Media Policy (<https://www.perthroyalshow.com.au/social-media-policy/>) and are required to use social media in a positive manner and with the best intentions.

- Whether posting on a public or private page or group, please present in a suitable and respectful manner to RASWA, Perth Royal Show and the Claremont Showground.
- Be mindful of posting/discussing subjects that may inflame someone's emotions. Please show respect for others' opinions and be courteous always.
- Do not post personal information about yourself or others, confidential or non-public information, offensive or negative comments.

If anyone is found to have made comments that are deemed unreasonable or derogatory, action will be taken by RASWA to ensure all parties are protected, and inappropriate use reprimanded.

PROMOTION

No advertising or promotion on behalf of commercial businesses will be permitted on the Showground without the prior written consent of the Society's Chief Executive Officer.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

The information provided by the Exhibitor in the application for entry is collected and used by the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia (RASWA) to organise and conduct competitions at the Show. We may publish details such as your name, address and exhibit details in any RASWA publication or communication. Such information may also be made available to, and published by, the media. We will not disclose your information without your consent for any other purpose unless required or authorised by law. You may request access to your personal information and, if necessary, request that our records of that information be corrected by writing to the Chief Executive Officer at the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910.

SECTION CONDITIONS

1. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1.1 All livestock exhibits must be bred by the Exhibitor, or owned, leased, or syndicated by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) months as at the date of judging and provide proof of the transaction by way of receipts or registration papers.

1.2 When an Exhibitor is officiating as a Judge at the Show and wishes to present animals for sale the Exhibitor is prohibited from exhibiting for judging purposes on that occasion.

1.3 All sheep must be shown in the wool unless otherwise specified.

1.4 No sheep, except those entered for sale or competition, will be allowed on the Showground without the permission of the Councillor in Charge.

1.5 **Duty of Care to Animals:** A person who has the care or charge of an animal has a duty to take all reasonable measures to ensure the welfare of that animal. According to the Animal Welfare (Cattle and Sheep) Regulations 2020 state that if a ewe is known to be or is visually assessed to be more than 19 weeks pregnant, she is unfit for transport.

1.6 All Exhibitors, or their nominee, must be in attendance and responsible for presentation of sheep to Judges.

1.7 Exhibitors of British breeds, Corriedale and other breeds are requested to provide suitable leads for their sheep to facilitate the handling and judging of exhibits if they so wish.

2. COMPLETION OF ENTRIES

2.1 **Definition of a Novice:** Restricted to breeders who have not won a first prize in Open classes at any Royal Show in the breed in which they are competing. Breeders competing in the Novice class can compete in the Open class. Novice class results do not count towards Governor Cup points.

2.2 Individual breed requirements are listed in the Breed Descriptions of the Australian Flock Register.

2.3 Ewes exhibited in lambs at foot classes must have a lamb that is purebred or registered appendix flock lamb of her own breeding at foot.

3. AGES OF SHEEP

3.1 As the industry recognises teeth as a readily available means of assessing the age of sheep, the following definitions are to be used to determine the correct age for various classes of competition for the purpose of the Show across all breeds of sheep.

3.2 Ages mentioned are a guide. Viewing teeth determines the ultimate classes in which sheep are to compete

3.3 A tooth is considered to have erupted once it has broken the gum. This interpretation is subject to breed inspector's decisions.

a) **All lamb classes:** No evidence of eruption of permanent teeth. Lamb's teeth (8 milk teeth). 1 month to 12 to 18 months.

b) **Under 1½ years:** Not to show more than two (2) permanent incisor teeth. Two-tooth (2 central incisors and 6 milk teeth). 2 to 18 months.

c) **Over 1½ years and under 2½ years:** Not to show more than four (4) permanent incisor teeth. Four-tooth (2 central, 2 middle incisors and 4 milk teeth). 18 months to 2 years.

d) **Over 2½ years and under 3½ years:** Not to show more than six (6) permanent incisor teeth. Six-tooth (2 central, 2 middle, 2 lateral incisors and 2 milk teeth). 2½ to 3½ years.

e) **Over 3½ years:** To show eight (8) permanent incisor teeth. Eight-tooth (2 central, 2 middle, 2 lateral and 2 corner incisors). 3½ to 4 years and older.

4. NUMBER OF ENTRIES PER CLASS

4.1 Exhibitors are limited to three (3) entries in any one (1) class and the Society reserves the right to further restrict entries to two (2) per class, after entries close, if found necessary because of lack of penning space.

5. TRANSFER OF ENTRIES

5.1 In all sheep breeds, animals entered in their incorrect age class may be transferred to their correct class subject to application being made to the Councillor in Charge and approved at least one (1) hour prior to the stipulated judging time, and subject to such transfer not exceeding the maximum number of entries allowed in any one (1) class. The onus is on the Exhibitor to be aware of any class transfers made by the inspection team.

5.2 **Merino:** Exhibits will be inspected with respect to wool type, e.g. super fine, fine, medium, or strong wool, and age on Friday 20 September 2024 after the completion of penning.

6. REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

6.1 No refunds will be given for livestock exhibits except where RASWA has excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

7. WITHDRAWAL OF EXHIBIT

7.1 A Veterinary certificate may be requested by RASWA if an exhibit is withdrawn due to illness or injury.

8. IRREGULAR SHEEP ENTRIES

8.1 In the event of sheep being entered in the wrong wool type, with exception of Merinos, the Judges have the right to request Stewards to place the exhibits in their correct class.

9. DAYS GROWTH OF WOOL

9.1 **Border Leicester:** Except in the classes provided for shorn sheep, all exhibits in these classes must be carrying

not less than nine (9) months nor more than 13 months growth of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

Long wool sheep in the under 1½ years class (not to show more than two (2) permanent teeth) need not be shorn but must carry a minimum of nine (9) months wool.

9.2 **Shropshire:** Exhibits in this section must be closely and evenly shorn and carrying not more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging. Wool classes carry no more than 9 months growth.

9.3 **Poll Dorset:** Shearing date for exhibits in wool classes will be between 1st December and 31st January in the year of competition. Rams to be machine shorn and untrimmed for all shorn classes.

9.4 **Corriedale:** In Corriedale sheep classes, limited restrictions are made on the number of days growth of wool to be carried by exhibits. Except for shorn classes, sheep may be exhibited either in full wool or half wool. For sheep in full wool, 10 to 13 months wool is acceptable. Sheep in half wool will be shorn after the Wagin Woolorama. The number of days wool must be stated on the application for entry for each sheep and they will be judged to make allowance for the different shearing dates.

9.5 **Ile de France:** All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

9.6 **Prime SAMM:** Shearing date for all classes except the wool class is 1st July in the year of competition, or two (2) weeks either side of this date. The wool class date is 1 February in the year of competition, or two (2) weeks either side of this date.

9.7 **Lincoln:** Exhibits in this breed must be carrying not less than nine (9) months nor more than thirteen (13) months growth of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

9.8 **Texel:** All entries must be carrying no more than 1.5cm of wool at time of inspection prior to judging.

9.9 **White Suffolk:** All sheep to be shorn on or after 15th August and untrimmed.

10. INSPECTIONS

10.1 To determine verification of TYPE, DESCRIPTION and ELIGIBILITY Breed Society Standard and Conformity to the schedule will be used for inspection, every entry in the Sheep catalogue is inspected prior to exhibiting. The inspection is undertaken by one nominated breed representative and one independent inspector appointed by the Royal Agricultural Society.

10.2 The inspection team must be able to inspect the entries for conformity to the breed standard and eligibility for its nominated class.

10.3 All exhibitors are to comply with the inspection times outlined.

10.4 Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Inspection Team.

10.5 The exhibitor is informed of any decision to disqualify and the Inspection Team will complete the inspection summary in the front of the breed results file.

10.6 An exhibitor or competitor has the right to appeal against the decision of the Inspection Team. A request must be lodged to the Councillor in Charge within one (1) hour after being notified. An Appeals Panel will meet to adjudicate the appeal, the Appeals Panel decision is final.

11. SCANNING

11.1 Sheep in Scan classes that have been penned should be ready for scanning from 3.00pm - 6.00pm, Tuesday 24 September. Please listen for shed announcements.

11.2 For breeders who nominate sheep in Scan classes for the Show, their animals will be scanned by Stocksmart at no charge.

11.3 Scanning is conducted under Stocksmart scanning' to avoid a potential conflict that scanners are working for their affiliated body whilst conducting scanning. If scanners are to show sheep, they are not to scan their own sheep.

11.4 Only sheep entered in scan classes at the Perth Royal Show are eligible to be scanned.

11.5 Any exhibitors who wish to utilize the services of the scanner must make those arrangements directly with the scanner. Out of competition scanning is purely at the discretion of the scanner and they are within their rights to charge a fee for this service.

12. FLOCK NUMBERS AND ELIGIBILITY

12.1 Exhibitors must provide the registered Flock Number of the breeder of each entry. All sheep competing in this section must be bred in a flock registered in a recognised Flock Book unless otherwise specified, and all exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor.

12.2 **Merino:** A Merino cannot be shown in a Poll Merino class and a Poll Merino cannot be shown in a Merino class. A sheep is only eligible to be shown in its class using the specific flock registration number. The flock registration numbers will be shown on the application for entry in each class.

13. SHEEP FOR EXHIBITION

13.1 All sheep will be required to have a NLIS tag and earmarks before they leave the property. They must meet the requirements of the stock (Identification and Movement) Act and could be shown and returned to their property. They must be accompanied by a NVD/Waybill and RASWA will keep a record of the animals that were at the Showground. **Exhibitors should use the Showground PIC Number WCSG0001 as the identifier of the Showground on the NVD/Waybill and specify their return address.**

14. SHEEP FOR SALE

14.1 They must meet NLIS requirements that is to be identified with an ear tag with the brand on it linked to the

PIC Number of the property from where the animal came from to the Showground (Showground PIC No. WCSG0001). The Agents must receive from the buyer the Brand PIC of the destination property before completing sale. Records must be kept and available to Inspectors.

14.2 Full information relating to Enzootic Disease Regulations 1970 or Stock (Identification and Movement) Act 1970 can be obtained from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development or www.agric.wa.au.gov.

15. MEDICATION CONTROL

15.1 The purpose of this condition is to ensure that the normal performance of an animal during competition is not affected, either deliberately or unintentionally, by the influence of drugs and medications, or by any form of veterinary treatment. No drugs shall be administered to any animal exhibited in this section, except under the direction of RASWA's Veterinary Surgeon who shall advise the Councillor in Charge if in their opinion, such drug, medication or veterinary treatment is likely to have any effect upon the animal, which would be material to its chance of being awarded a prize, and in such case the Councillor in Charge may bar the animal from competing.

15.2 RASWA may make, or cause to be made, such test or tests of an animal, as it shall deem necessary to determine whether such drug has been administered to any animal which has been entered for, or has been exhibited in, any class or competition.

16. MOVEMENT OF STOCK TO WA

16.1 There are strict requirements for bringing livestock into WA. A completed Health Certificate for Movement of Stock to Western Australia (Form LB1), available from the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, must accompany each consignment of livestock en route into WA. It contains all entry requirements for livestock and is used to certify that livestock meet these requirements. For further information please contact the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

16.2 Sheep purchased which are to remain in Western Australia will be subject to continuing quarantine surveillance as specified by Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

17. VETERINARY INSPECTIONS

17.1 Compulsory Veterinary inspections will be carried out on the day of competition.

18. VETERINARY SERVICES

18.1 A Veterinary Officer will be on call throughout the Show to provide services to injured or sick livestock. Exhibitors requiring services will be responsible for payment for all services rendered.

18.2 The Veterinary Office and Medication Control Centre is located at the corner of Edgar Avenue and the Cattle Lanes.

18.3 The duty Veterinary Officer can be contacted from 6.00am to 9.00pm through Asset Services on (08) 6263 3161 or (08) 6263 3146. After 9.00pm on any day please call Asset Services on (08) 6263 3127.

19. AUTOPSY

19.1 If at any time an animal which has been shown or is to be shown at the Show dies at the Showground, the Exhibitor/Owner shall not remove or permit the animal to be removed from the Showground without the prior written permission of RASWA's Veterinary Officer.

19.2 The Veterinary Officer will determine if the animal requires an autopsy to determine the cause of death. The Councillor in Charge will contact DPIRD to arrange the autopsy.

19.3 If the exhibitor requests an autopsy, it will be at the exhibitor's expense.

19.4 Asset Services should be notified of death. They may be able to assist with the disposal of the carcass.

20. OVINE BRUCELLOSIS

20.1 The rams of all breeds of sheep (unless a Breed Society has a specific ruling) will be required to be tested and Ovine Brucellosis negative in the year of competition. This means an exhibit must have either full accreditation or a serological blood test by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development showing negative results.

20.2 All rams exhibited must come from flocks registered with the Ovine Brucellosis (Ram Flock) accreditation scheme of the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, or all Exhibitors must provide a certificate from a Veterinary Surgeon certifying that their rams have been:

a) serologically TESTED TWICE for Brucella Ovis with negative results at an interval of 60 to 150 days.

b) clinically examined for epididymides with negative results; and

c) isolated from other sheep for a period of 21 days before the first serological test until exhibition at the Show.

A COPY OF THE CERTIFICATE MUST ACCOMPANY THE APPLICATION FOR ENTRY.

21. OVINE JOHNE'S DISEASE (OJD)

21.1 The National Sheep Health Statement (SHS) provides Exhibitors with the opportunity to declare their flock status. The form is included in the schedule and is voluntary.

22. FOOTROT

22.1 Footrot in sheep is caused by bacterial infection with *Dichelobacter nodosus*. Both virulent and benign footrot start as inflammation of the skin between the toes accompanied by moisture, reddening and loss of hair. Additional signs include varying degrees of lameness with one or more feet affected. Virulent footrot is a reportable disease in WA, and laboratory testing is required to diagnose virulent footrot or rule out presentations of a similar nature such as benign footrot and foot abscesses.

22.2 All entered sheep must be from a flock that is clinically free from virulent footrot.

22.3 All entered sheep must be from a flock that is clinically free from benign footrot or Ovine Interdigital Dermatitis (OID) (Scald). If benign footrot is present on the property, a Department of Primary Industries & Regional Development (DPIRD) Biosecurity & Agricultural Management Act (BAMA) inspector must have checked, sampled and tested sufficient sheep on the property to be confident that only benign footrot is present. The BAMA Inspector must provide this advice to the RAS Councillor in charge of sheep prior to the commencement of the Perth Royal Show.

Note this process may take up to four weeks.

22.4 All entered sheep must be checked for lesions consistent with footrot. No sheep showing signs of footrot are to be brought to the show grounds.

23. DIPPING AND/OR PARASITIC CONTROL

23.1 All shorn sheep must comply with Government regulations and any necessary declarations lodged with Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development. This condition does not apply to sheep which are to be taken directly back to the Exhibitors' property and are not for sale.

24. FODDER

24.1 All Fodder must be purchased at the time of entry.

25. LOCKERS

25.1 Exhibitors may reserve lockers by completing and forwarding with entries. Locker's measure 180cm x 130cm x 130cm and are a fee of **\$2.50 per locker**, which is payable with entries.

25.2 Exhibitors are required to supply their own locks, if required, for all feed lockers.

25.3 Only Exhibitors who have more than 10 sheep can be allocated more than one (1) locker.

26. STOCK BEDDING

26.1 Bedding will be supplied by RASWA. Exhibitors are requested to be as economical as possible in their use of bedding.

26.2 Each pen will be provided with half a bale of straw at the start of the competition and refurbishment straw is allocated at one bale per five pens per day.

26.3 Extra bedding can be purchased at time of entry.

27. CLEANING OF PENS

27.1 All straw from pens must be placed at the end of aisles by no later than 8.00am every day. Shed staff will be closing off access to the main alleyway at 8.00am to allow for the Dingo to operate safely. Fresh straw will be made available from 6.30am each morning.

27.2 Height of straw must never be allowed to build up above 200mm from the base of the pen.

27.3 Exhibitors are not required to clean out pens on the last Saturday of the Show.

27.4 Exhibitors must Endeavor not to waste bedding straw.

27.5 In the case of rams in pens that predominantly urinate in the centre of the pen, please remove all soiled bedding with fork and then pull remaining straw from edge of pen to cover up hole created, then add a limited quantity of fresh bedding to top up pen in accordance with point 27.2.

27.6 In the case of ewes, the reverse should be practiced as centre is possibly unsoiled.

27.7 These requests are made in the interest of reducing the quantity of bedding used. The practice by some Exhibitors to keep adding fresh straw is not to continue as the smell builds up. If this rule is not adhered to it may become necessary to charge for straw.

28. ELECTRICAL DEVICES AND CORDS

28.1 Any Exhibitor intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showground will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residential current protection, and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged.

28.2 Only those electrical appliances and electrical cords with the required tag can be used on the Showground.

28.3 The use of double adapters is prohibited. All power boards must be tested and tagged.

29. ARRIVALS

29.1 Vehicles delivering exhibits are to enter through "Private Road" Gate 6 off Graylands Road, open from 6.00am to 8.00pm.

29.2 Sheep vehicles are to proceed east along "Private Road" to the Jim Horwood Pavilion.

29.3 Access to the pavilion is via the concrete ramp on the Western side of the pavilion and driving up the landing deck where mobile unloading ramps are available.

29.4 Exit is through Gate 8.

29.5 Vehicles will NOT be able to enter at Gate 8 off Ashton Avenue after the Show commences.

30. PENNING

30.1 All Sheep must be penned by the times stated below for each breed. If unavoidably delayed in transit, special arrangements are to be made with the Councillor in Charge in the Jim Horwood Pavilion.

30.2 It will be the responsibility of the Exhibitor or their agent to place the sheep in pens allocated to them in whatever order they desire to best show off their exhibits. Pen numbers bear no relation to their catalogue number. Once penned, the pen number can then be written in on the catalogue tag for management purposes. Prior to the penning of exhibited sheep, no sheep except those entered for competition shall be allowed in the competition pens.

30.3 After being penned, only Breed Society Officials, Exhibitors or their representatives are allowed to handle sheep prior to being judged. Any person breaching this condition is liable to expulsion from the Showground.

31. OBJECTIVE MEASUREMENT

31.1 Exhibitors will be notified of when they will be required to bring their animals forward.

31.2 The priority traits to be measured that affect meat yield are:

- Fat thickness (depth)
- Rib eye depth or rib eye area

The software program used calculates these measurements. The program uses a formula that ranks or promotes animals that have the current desirable measurements to increase meat yield or have a good correlation of fat and meat in proportion to live weight.

Each animal is given objective measurement points to a maximum of 60 (calculated by the program) and the Judge adds his final structural and personal assessment points to a maximum of 40.

The points are then totalled by the steward and the highest point scoring animals are then awarded by the Judge.

- a) Each breed to be scanned on a breed basis to make a valid comparison of entries in that breed.
- b) Only entries nominated on the application for entry in a scan class will be eligible to compete in a scan class across all breeds.
- c) All scanning takes place on Tuesday afternoon between 3-6pm. Exhibitors will be called up from 3pm.

32. DRESS CODE FOR JUDGING RING

32.1 The minimum dress code required before entering the judging ring has been determined by the RASWA Sheep Committee as:

- a) Closed in footwear;
- b) Long trousers; and
- c) Collared shirt

33. FAILURE TO COMPETE

33.1 An Exhibitor/Owner not bringing forward their exhibits to compete forfeits their right to stalls or pens allotted to such animal.

34. REMOVAL TIMES

34.1 **Merino, Poll Merino and Corriedale:** All exhibits may depart after 5.00pm Monday 23 September 2024 and must be totally cleared by 12.00pm on Tuesday 24 September 2024.

34.2 **Australian White, Shropshire, South Suffolk, Wilshire Horn, Texel, Suffolk, Prime SAMM, Wiltipoll, Poll Dorset, White Suffolk, Border Leicester, Dorper, White Dorper, Lincoln and Ile De France:** All exhibits may depart after 3.30pm Saturday 28 September 2024.

34.3 **All Breeds Ram and Ewe Sale:** At the conclusion of the All-Breeds Stud Ram and Ewe Sale on Friday 27 September 2024.

34.4 In extreme circumstances, arrangements for early departure can be made with the Councillor in Charge.

34.5 Livestock Release Authority forms must be obtained for all sheep.

35. SPONSORSHIP

35.1 Only registered members of the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association (ASSBA) are eligible for ASSBA sponsorship in the Meat Breed Stud section of the Show.

LIVESTOCK SALES REGULATIONS

NOMINATIONS

For sale of Rams & Ewes, please nominate to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA through the entry system.

Nomination must indicate the six-digit Sheep Genetics Tag Number or NLIS Tag Number if not utilising Lambplan for all sheep nominated.

Nomination must indicate if a Ram or Ewe is being offered in the sale.

Please be aware that a minimum price of \$2000 for Rams and \$500 for Ewes will be the reserve price set on the Sale Day by Sale Agents.

All Rams and Ewes must be registered with relevant Breed Societies.

HEALTH

All sale animals nominated must adhere to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Health protocols.

BREEDS

The sale order by breed will be as follows unless changed by the Royal Agricultural Society Sheep Committee:

South Suffolk – Suffolk – White Suffolk – Poll Dorset – Other Breeds (order depending on whether they have sold in the previous year or previously).

Rams sell first in the breed first, then followed by the Ewes.

VENDORS

Vendor selling order will be determined by highest sale average from previous year's sale. The average price will be determined on a minimum of three (3) Rams or Ewes sold for example:

3 offered and 1 sold at \$3200.
3 offered and 2 sold @ \$5400.

2 at sale reserve price \$2000
1 at sale reserve price \$2000

Average = Total \$7200 / 3 = \$2400
Average = Total \$7400 / 3 = \$2466

Vendors can offer a total of 60% of their nominated animals in the first run of each breed and then sell remainder in subsequent runs. All Rams or Ewes to be sold out for returning vendors.

New vendors (even if they miss a year) sell at the back of the Breed. If multiple new vendors nominate, then they will be allocated sale order on stud name alphabetically.

Vendors may only nominate a total of two (2) Ewes for the sale. An exemption to this number, if agreeable by the Sale agents, will be for a genuine stud dispersal of elite genetics.

A Champion Ram of the Breed can be elevated to the first lot of the breed on sale day if the vendor has Rams nominated in the sale and then the Champion Ram is to be substituted for one of the Rams already nominated by that vendor. If the vendor does not have any rams nominated in the sale, then the Champion Ram cannot be offered in the sale.

SALE CATALOGUE

The sales catalogue will be prepared by conducting selling agent that year. All nominated animals must have Sheep genetics ID tag or NLIS tag details to selling agent by no later than three (3) weeks prior to sale day, Friday 6 September.

Sale Catalogue will be finalised on the Friday 20 September, one week before sale.

Catalogue will go to print on Tuesday 24 September.

Late changes after the last Friday will not be entered into the printed catalogues.

Electronic catalogues will be sent out across Australia on Monday 9 September, with changes up to the Last Friday.

Sheep Genetics figures will be entered from their most current run to the Last Friday before sale day.

DISPUTES

Any disputes arising before the sale are to be directed to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA Councillor in Charge of Sheep.

ALL BREEDS RAM AND EWE SALE

Sale exhibits must meet NLIS requirements, identified with a brand ear tag linked to the PIC number of the property from where the exhibit came from to the Showground.

From the buyer, the agent must receive the brand PIC of the destination property before completing sale. Records must be kept and available to inspectors.

All sheep in transit in Western Australia must be accompanied by a NVD as required by the Stock (Identification & Movement) Act 1970.

All nominated sheep are to be moved to the sale pens next to the sale ring by 9am on the morning of the sale.

1. The object of the Governor's Cup award is to encourage Exhibitors to compete with the highest quality pedigree breeding exhibits and reward both excellence and consistency throughout the whole range of their exhibits.

2. The Governor's Cup is only open to bonafide Western Australian Exhibitors. Government Institutions including Agricultural Schools and Colleges are eligible to compete.

3. ALL ANIMALS ARE TO BE ENTIRE e.g. Geldings and spayed mares are not allowed.

4. Sections and Breed classes in which points can be gained are as follows with exclusions as stated:

ALPACA: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Group and Special classes.

CATTLE: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Progeny, Group and Special classes.

GOATS: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Progeny and Group classes.

HORSES: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes, excluding Ridden, Group and Special classes.

SHEEP: First, Second and Third prize winners from all Single Pen classes and Pairs, but excluding Novice, Group and Special classes.

5. All livestock exhibits must be either:

(a) Bred by the Exhibitor, or owned, leased or syndicated by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) months as at the date of judging and provide proof of the transaction by way of receipts or registration papers.

(b) Exhibited by the original owner under arrangement with the purchaser.

6. (a) The Exhibitor can enter all classes in their breed section, but the maximum number of classes for which an Exhibitor will gain Governor's Cup points are from the highest scoring ten (10) Single Pen classes.

(b) In the event of a tie for first place, the Governor's Cup will be jointly awarded.

7. An EXHIBIT is DEFINED, for the purposes of this award, as follows:

(a) As per Single Pen classes.

AN EXHIBIT MAY ONLY RECEIVE POINTS ONCE.

8. Points will be allotted as follows:

First 4 points

Second 2 points

Third 1 point

If an Exhibitor has multiple placing's within a class then all placing points will be included in the total for that class.

Championships will NOT be included unless the circumstances below apply:

9. Points will not be allocated unless at least TWO (2)

EXHIBITORS participate in each class except in the event of the animal going on to win a Championship or Reserve Championship with competition, in which case points scored on the Governor's up scale will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed. If an animal has not been awarded any Governor's Cup points because it faced no competition in its breed or section, but that animal goes on to win an award with competition, points scored on the Governor's Cup scale will be awarded for the original class in which the animal competed.

10. Livestock sections should address a means of promoting excellence within their respective areas. It will lead to competition across the sections.

11. Declaration on Entry Form: To be eligible for participation in the Governor's Cup Competition you must have signed the Declaration on the entry form to acknowledge that you have read all the Rules and Regulations governing the Governor's Cup Competition and you agree to abide by them.
