

CREATIVE ARTSSection Conditions

1. RESTRICTIONS ON NUMBER OF ENTRIES

Exhibitors are restricted to **ONE (1)** entry per class, unless otherwise stated.

An entry consists of **ONE (1)** item, unless otherwise stated.

2. CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY

The whole exhibit <u>MUST</u> be the bona fide work of the individual Exhibitor, unless otherwise stated. No small business entries will be accepted, unless otherwise stated.

All work <u>MUST</u> have been completed in the 18 months prior to the Show.

- No exhibit can be entered in more than one (1) class.
- No article or work, which has previously been exhibited at the Perth Royal Show, is eligible to compete.
- Any article entered which is in doubt will be accepted and judged subject to the person entering signing a statutory declaration that such work has never been entered previously and is the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.

No Lego to be used.

Exhibitors must ensure that their exhibits comply with specifications within each class i.e. number of exhibits within a class, and maximum or minimum size of item(s).

All entries must not have been worn or have been displayed on social media, except for the Cosplay Classes.

Any exhibit incorrectly entered will be marked 'NAS' (NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE) and will not be judged nor be eligible for a prize and may not be displayed.

Except where it is an acceptable part of the finishing, or where stated in the conditions, exhibits that have been washed or dry cleaned will be disqualified from competition. Pre-shrinking of fabrics, lace and crochet is permitted.

- All entries must display the RASWA number slip on the front of each entered article
- If the name of the exhibitor or any other identification mark appears on the entry, the entry will be disqualified unless masked for judging before submission (unless otherwise specified).
- Masking may be removed by Stewards before display.

Exhibitors may submit any information, which may be of value to the Stewards or of interest to the public.

All framed pictures and wall hangings <u>MUST</u> have facilities for secure hanging.

Backing card should be in proportion to the article(s) being displayed.

Large exhibits may not be fully displayed.

3. REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

No refunds will be given for exhibits except where RASWA has excess entries in a section or class and is unable to accommodate them.

If an exhibit is withdrawn, rejected, or disqualified by RASWA for any reason, the entry fee will NOT be refundable.

4. CATALOGUES

Catalogues are available at a cost of \$10.00. These can only be purchased on the application for entry and are not compulsory.

5. SALE OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits must not be offered for sale.

6. DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS

RASWA's exhibit number will be emailed to the Exhibitor prior to the Show.

RASWA's exhibit number must be securely sewn or attached in an appropriate manner on each exhibit and the exhibits arranged so that this number can be easily seen on the **front** of the article, when delivered to the Showground.

Exhibits may be posted to the Royal Agricultural Society of WA, PO Box 135, Claremont WA 6910, and it is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that the articles arrive by the due date, and if from overseas to take into account delays caused by Customs inspections, etc.

POSTAL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE A SEPARATE RETURN SELF ADDRESSED PAID BAG, ALLOWING ENTRIES TO BE RETURNED AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE SHOW.

7. DISPLAY

1st, 2nd, 3rd and Highly Commended exhibits will be displayed. Occasionally, due to limited display space other exhibits may not be displayed.

8. JUDGING

Judges ARE NOT permitted to show in any class in which they may be involved in judging.

Judges are requested to withhold awards where entries are not of a sufficiently high standard.

The judges' decision is final, and no correspondence shall be entered into.

9. COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors who want their exhibit returned by post, courier or air, must advise RASWA in writing and prepay the cost.

All exhibits must be collected within seven (7) days from the conclusion of the Show, unless pre-arranged with the Competition and Event Coordinator.

There is no guarantee personal items for display purposes such as hangers, boxes etc. will be returned.

9. AWARDS

Prize certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Highly Commended and Special Prizes.

BEADING

A bead is a small object that can be glass, crystal, wood, ceramic, semi-precious stones, pearls or paper with a hole or holes through which a thread can be used to join them.

Beading is the art of joining one (1) or more beads together by using any thread, chain, jumprings, fireline, silk or the like to make a necklace, bracelet, bangle, earrings or wall hanging in any beading stitch (e.g. peyote spiral).

Copied work should come with the name of the original artist.

Judging Criteria:

Artistic merit and craftsmanship.

CALLIGRAPHY

- Maximum outside framed dimension of 700mm x 750mm in all classes.
- · No identifying names to be shown on articles.
- Must be mounted or framed where appropriate.

Presentation:

- Any calligraphy hand.
- · Two or three dimensional form.
- Consider the use of colour, gold, handmade papers and/or embossing or multimedia.

Judging Criteria:

- · Quality and consistency of the chosen hand.
- Layout and design of the overall piece.
- · Suitability of the chosen hand to the words used.
- Suitability of the colour, illustrations, presentation and/or framing to the chosen words.

COSPLAY

Judging Criteria

Suitability of materials used.

- Finishing of costume/article. Neatness of seams/construction.
- Techniques used, design and quality of build.
- Originality and difficulty of design. Integrity of design.

All entries must be suitable for display as this is a family friendly event.

Class 35 Cosplay Seamstress Outfit

Garment made using machine and hand sewing as main form of construction. 70% of the garment must be fabric. Garment can be embellished using leather, metalwork, sequins, beading or a combination of embellishments. Garment must be able to be worn. Please supply mannequin for display.

Class 36 Armor Smith Outfit

Can use a combination of materials including foam, clay, leatherwork, metalwork, fabric, textiles or wood work. Must be able to worn. You are encouraged to submit a build book with your outfit.

Class 37 Wigs

To suit an individual Cosplay garment. Styling, colour, texture. Please supply a mannequin head for display purposes. Entrants may supply a photograph of the Cosplay garment. (no requirement for the complete outfit to be supplied).

Class 38 Props

Any single accessory that enhances the visual appeal to a Cosplay costume or outfit. No larger than 1.5m in length or weighing more than 5kg. Entrants may supply a photograph of the cosplay garment.

Any garment excluding booties / baby footwear.

Must use 4ply or under. Size not exceeding 1m in width or length.

Class 44 Adult Headwear

Must have stitch pattern or colour work, not to be plain in single colour (no headbands).

Any ply or weight, please include information on method or pattern stitch.

DOLLS & TOYS

- For Junior classes please refer to the end of the Creative Arts section.
- The clothing on Dolls and Toys is included in judging and needs to be properly finished.
- No shank buttons on baby wear.
- Matching threads should be used on materials.
- Stuffing should be even, consistent and appropriate to the toy (e.g. firm, slightly floppy etc.).
- Joins where filling is inserted should be invisible. Ladder stitch is suggested.

- Chutney: Tangy, sweet pickle of Indian origin based on chopped fruit and/or other vegetables. Served as an accompaniment to curries, hot and cold meats and savouries.
- Relish: Sharp, tangy and based on fruit and/or other vegetables. Usually contains vinegar and sugar, but generally not in large enough quantities to preserve the ingredients for as long as most pickles. They add zest to hot or cold meats, curries and savoury snacks.
- Pickles: Two (2) types.
 - 1) Thick and pulpy, usually vegetables and thickened either by slow cooking to evaporate the liquid and concentrate the flavours or by thickening the liquid with flour.

- 5. Blocks or polystyrene may be used to simulate cakes unless otherwise stated but the final design must be achievable in cake.
- 6. All cakes are to be covered in fondant / R.T.R (Ready To Roll), unless otherwise stated.
- Exhibitor label to be attached to the front left of exhibit. Please read the individual Class requirements carefully, to ensure your entry complies to that Class.
- 8. Cakes that are deemed to be structurally unsound will not be accepted.

PERMITTED ARE:

- 1. A minimal amount of florists' wire, florist tape, stamens, corn silk, cotton net, thread and tulle.
- Edible food grade metallic colour, edible glitter and lustres will be allowed provided the name of the product used is included on the "Information Card".
- Ribbon, braid and cord may be used to compliment or highlight cake decorating techniques but should not be used as the main feature or focus of the exhibit
- 4. Edible sprinkles, cashous, dragees, sugar pearls can be used to highlight features. The name of the product to be included on your "Information Card".
- Paper, fabric, lace, ribbon, braid, cord, lustre/shimmer powder. and non-toxic commercial glue may be used on board presentation.
- 6. Thick glass and mirror may be used as base/presentation boards.
- Wooden or Perspex skewers and food approved cake support systems are permitted for support in tiered and Novelty/Sculptured cakes and sugar art.
- 8. Covered boards and hard food safe barriers may be used to support decorations.
- 9. Manufactured pillars may be used to support tiered cakes, plaques and floral arrangement.

- 10. Floristry wire may be used but must be placed in either a commercial posy pick with the top edge visible above the covering cake, or the wire is coated in edible wax (e.g. bees wax) and again must have the top edge visible. Either technique must be declared on the "Information Card"
- 11. Foam flower centres may be used but must be declared on the "Information Card".

NOT PERMITTED ARE:

- 1. Pins of any description.
- Wire which penetrates the surface of the cake (unless otherwise stated).
- 3. Manufactured ornaments and decorations.
- 4. Glass of any description, except as base/presentation board.
- 5. Plant stems and foliage.
- Mechanical aids and any other manufactured material, unless otherwise stated.
- 7. Wafer Paper and gelatine are not to be used as a main feature, unless otherwise stated.

NB: WIRE OF ANY KIND (INCLUDING FOOD GRADE)
MUST NOT PENETRATE THE SURFACE OF THE
CAKE. A POSY PIC OR EDIBLE WAX IS ALLOWED, BUT
MUST BE STATED ON THE "INFORMATION CARD".

Exhibits that do not comply with these rules will be marked '**NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE**' (NAS) and will not be judged, nor be eligible for a prize.

INFORMATION CARD: This card will be sent to the Exhibitor and must be completed. The card is to be handed to the Steward when the exhibit is delivered, which is made available to the Judge(s). The card should list new techniques and items used to enable the entry to conform to the schedule. It confirms the Exhibitor has abided by the rules of the competition.

JUDGING:

The judges will take the following in to consideration when judging;

- · Overall design & concept
- Degree of difficulty & complexity
- · Visual appeal & WOW factor
- · Quality of workmanship & attention to detail

Remember it is better to display fewer techniques that are executed to a great skill level than many techniques poorly done.

Marks are deducted for lack of originality - make sure you create your own design.

Must be iced with Fondant / R.T.R (Ready To Roll). No buttercream icing to be used.

Your cake must be placed on a base presentation board which can be decorated to suit your design.

Base/presentation board or drape to **fit within** a **30cm square**.

First: \$25, Sash, Certificate; Second: \$15, Certificate; Third: \$10, Certificate; Highly

DECORATED CAKES - AMATEUR

An Exhibitor, who has not won a first (1st) prize in a similar class at the Perth Royal Show more than twice, has no more than 3 years of cake decorating experience, has not, nor previously been a teacher of cake decorating and does not promote their work in any form of media, or receive payment for decorating cakes, may enter in the Amateur category.

Class 92 Decorated Wedding Cake

Two (2) or more cakes to be tiered or otherwise presented on a common board. Base/presentation board or drape to **fit within a 45cm square**.

NB: A base display board must be used.

Hints / Tips

- The use of molds, cutters, lace mats etc are permitted. More points are awarded if these are used creatively.
- Think about your overall theme and make sure your techniques & elements align to this. Judges will look for cohesiveness.
- Your cake will be judged all-round, not from the front. Make sure it looks spectacular from all angles.
- Sugar flowers can be realistic or fantasy.

First: \$70, Certificate; Second: \$50, Certificate; Third: \$30, Certificate; Highly

Class 93 Celebration Cake

One (1) tier only. A greeting to be included. Base/presentation board or drape to **fit within a 40cm square**.

NB: A base display board must be used.

Commended : Certificate

Class 94 Sculptured Cake

An imaginative creation in shape and design suitable for a child's celebration. No support systems or structures to be used, apart from One (1) central dowel. The majority of the exhibit must be cake with the remainder of the exhibit made from an edible medium (e.g. Rice Krispy Treats, Chocolate). The cake must be carved to shape and not made in a specific model shaped tin. No armature and support systems may be used. No styrofoam supports to be used. Details of construction to be listed on the "Information Card". Base/presentation board or drape to fit within a 40cm square.

Hints / Tips

- The idea of this class is to showcase what can be made using cake rather than a decorative show piece. For this reason rules are very strict and the exhibit must be made from cake.
- Bigger is not necessarily better. Work what you feel is right for the project.
- Choice of cake used is important a dense cake gives a better structure.
- The cake is not tasted.

First: \$50, Certificate; Second: \$35, Certificate; Third: \$15, Certificate; Highly

Commended : Certificate

Class 95 Decorated Cupcakes

Six (6) cupcakes to be decorated using a theme of your choosing. Cases to remain on the cupcakes. No fresh cream, buttercream, ganache, fruits or flowers to be used.

Base / presentation board to fit within 30cm square. The base / presentation board can be decorated to fit within your theme.

Hints / Tips

- Toppers that are excessive in size or height compared to the cupcake will not look balanced
- The cupcakes will not be tasted.
- The majority of points are awarded to your cupcake design, not additional elements on your display board.

Class 96 Specimen Flower - Rose

A single stem Rose including bud and foliage.

Suitable Flower/Sugar Paste must be used. Cold Porcelain or Wafer Paper will not be accepted.

Exhibitor to provide own single stem vase to display their entry. The vase to be collected at end of Show.

First: \$25, Certificate; Second: \$15, Certificate; Third: \$10, Certificate; Highly

Commended: Certificate

DECORATED CAKES - OPEN

An Exhibitor, who has either more than three(3) years cake decorating experience, or who has won a first (1st) prize in a similar class at the Perth Royal Show more than twice in the Amateur Section. Is, or has been, a teacher of cake decorating and/or promotes their work in any form of media, or receive payment for decorating cakes, must enter the Open Section.

Class 97 Decorated Wedding Cake

Two (2) or more cakes to be tiered or otherwise presented on a common board. Base/presentation board or drape to fit within a 55cm square.

Hints / Tips

- The use of molds, cutters, lace mats etc are permitted. Think about how you can use these creatively.
- Think about your overall theme and make sure your techniques & elements align to this. Judges will look for cohesiveness.
- Your cake will be judged all-round, not just from the front. Make sure it looks spectacular from all angles.
- Sugar flowers can be realistic, or fantasy.

First: Sash. Certificate. \$100: Second: \$60. Certificate; Third: Certificate, \$40; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 98 Avante-Garde Wedding Cake

As the definition of Avante-Garde suggests -"new and experimental ideas and methods in art, music, or literature".

Use any new or traditional cake decorating technique or medium in an exciting way.

All elements must be edible. No fresh or dried fruits, vegetables, foliage, nuts or seeds.

Two (2) or more cakes to be tiered or otherwise presented on a common board.

Base / presentation board or drape to fit within a 55cm square.

First: \$100, Sash, Certificate; Second: \$60, Certificate; Third: \$40, Certificate; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 99 **Celebration Cake**

One (1) tier suitable for a special occasion. Base/presentation board or drape to fit within a 40cm square.

First: \$50, Certificate; Second: \$30, Certificate; Third: Certificate, \$20; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 100 Novelty Cake

MUST CONTAIN FOOD SAFE ARMATEUR

An imaginative creation in shape and design. The majority of the exhibit must be cake with the remainder of the exhibit made from an edible medium (e.g. Rice Krispy Treats, Chocolate). The cake must be cut to shape, not made in a specific model shaped tin. Food approved armature and cake support systems must be used. If entry does not contain armateur it will be classed as a sculpted entry.

Details of construction to be listed on the "Information Card". Base/presentation board or drape to fit within a 40cm square.

Hints / Tips

The idea of this class is to showcase what can be made using cake rather than a decorative showpiece. For this reason rules are very strict and the exhibit must be made from cake.

- Bigger is not necessarily better. Work what you feel is right for the project.
- Choice of cake used is important a dense cake gives better structure.
- · The cake is not tasted.

First: \$100, Sash, Certificate; Second: \$60, Certificate; Third: Certificate, \$40; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 101 Sculptured Cake

An imaginative creation in shape and design. Must be fully edible - no support systems or structures allowed, apart from One (1) central dowel. **The majority of the exhibit must be cake** with the remainder of the exhibit made from an edible medium (e.g. Rice Krispy Treats, Chocolate).

The cake must be carved to shape, not made in a specific model shaped tin. No armature or significant support systems may be used. No styrofoam supports to be used.

Details of construction to be listed on the "Information Card". Base/presentation board or drape to **fit within a 40cm square**.

A short paragraph (no more than 60 words) to be included on the 'Information Card" describing the meaning of your sculpture.

Hints / Tips

- The idea of this class is to showcase what can be made using cake rather than a decorative showpiece. For this reason rules are very strict and the exhibit must be made from cake.
- Bigger is not necessarily better. Work what you feel is right for the project.
- Choice of cake used is important a dense cake gives better structure.
- · The cake is not tasted.

First: \$70, Sash, Certificate; Second: \$50, Certificate; Third: Certificate, \$30; Highly Commended: Certificate

Class 102 Buttercream Cake or Ganache Cake Featuring Modern Lambeth Piping.

Featuring buttercream or Ganache as the medium. This exhibit will be refrigerated during Show. Base/presentation board to **fit within a 40cm square**.

First: \$25, Certificate; Second: \$15, Certificate; Third: \$10, Certificate; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 103 Gingerbread House

All decorations to be made from a sugar or sugar based medium. No commercial lollies allowed. Base/presentation board to **fit within a 40cm square**.

First: \$40, Certificate; Second: \$20, Certificate; Third: \$10, Certificate; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 104 Specimen Flower - Peony (Open)

A single stem which must include one (1) full bloom Peony (Open) and can include leaves and one (1) bud.

Suitable Flower/Sugar Paste must be used. Cold Porcelain or Wafer Paper will not be accepted.

Exhibitor to provide own single stem vase to display their entry. The vase to be collected at end of Show.

Class 105 2D Sugar Art

A piece of 2D Art Work which will be displayed on an easel. Using only edible mediums. Can be framed with a frame handcrafted from sugar. Artwork to be created on display board that fits within a 25cm square.

Hints / Tips

- Think of your exhibit as a piece of artwork
- It will be judged on an easel, so will be standing up.

DECORATED CAKES - MASTER

Only an Exhibitor who has previously won a first (1st) prize in the corresponding class in the Open category of the Perth Royal Show may enter this category.

Exhibitors in the Master's category may not enter in the corresponding class in the Open category.

Class 106 Couture Wedding Cake

Three (3) or more cakes to be tiered or otherwise presented on a common board.

The design must be based on a Wedding Dress (either the whole dress or elements). A picture of the inspiration dress must be supplied for judging, along with the Information Sheet.

Base/presentation board or drape to **fit within** a **55cm square**.

First: \$150, Sash, Certificate; Second: \$90, Certificate; Third: Certificate, \$60; Highly

Commended: Certificate

Class 107 Illusion Cake - Novelty

The cake must look as close to the object you are trying to interpret/replicate and must be true to the size of the object.

A sculpted/carved cake, with **the majority of the exhibit being cake** with the remainder made from an edible medium (e.g. Rice Krispy Treats, Chocolate).

The cake must look as close to the object you are trying to interpret/replicate and must be true to the size of the object. Please provide the image of what you are trying to replicate.

Details of construction to be listed on the 'Information Card".

Base/presentation board or drape to **fit within** a **40cm square**.

First: \$100, Sash, Certificate; Second: \$60, Certificate; Third: Certificate, \$40; Highly

GENERAL SHOW

Regulations

The Society's General Show Regulations and Section Conditions regulate the conduct of the Show. Upon acceptance of an entry the Exhibitor is irrevocably contracted to be bound by those General Show Regulations and Section Conditions.

A copy of the Society's General Show Regulations may be obtained on application or downloaded from the website http://perthroyalshow.com.au/general-regulations/.

An Exhibitor who breaches any General Show Regulation or Section Condition may be disqualified, or suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalised.

WITHDRAWAL OF EXHIBIT BY THE SOCIETY

The Society may, at its sole discretion, withdraw, reject or disqualify an exhibit. Refer to the Society's General Show Regulation 3.18.

PRIZE MONEY

RASWA has a policy whereby all prize money is paid by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer). Your banking details will be kept secure and can only be used by RASWA to credit your bank account. Please complete your account details on the application for entry even if you have provided them previously. In accordance with the rules of the competition, failure to provide your bank details will mean that any prize money you earn will be forfeited and retained by RASWA.

Prize money as stated in the schedule does not include GST. The prize money which the Society pays to successful Exhibitors ("you") depends on the information that you provide to the Society.

If you confirm that you are GST registered and provide your Australian Business Number (ABN) the Society will pay the appropriate prize money plus 10% GST. The Society will provide to you a Recipient Created Tax Invoice (RCTI) within 28 days of the day you were successful at your event, detailing the GST which you will need to submit to the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

If any adjustments need to be made, the Society will issue an adjustment note to you within 28 days of the adjustment. Upon entry into the competition and completion and signing of the application form, this form will become a RCTI agreement as required under (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999.

Furthermore, you acknowledge your agreement to the following:

- The Society will issue you a tax invoice in respect of the successful exhibit;
- You are requested not to issue a tax invoice to the Society in respect to prize money received;
- It will be necessary for you to notify the Society if you cease to be registered for GST; and
- The Society will notify you if it ceases to satisfy any of the requirements of the determinations.

If you provide your ABN but are not registered for GST, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the prize schedule.

If you are a business Exhibitor and do not provide your ABN to the Society, 47% tax will be deducted from your prize money under the ATO PAYG provisions.

If you confirm that you are entering as part of a private recreational pursuit or hobby, the Society will pay the prize money as detailed in the prize schedule.

INSURANCE

As the Society accepts no liability for loss or damage occasioned to or by any property exhibited, it is recommended that the Exhibitor arranges appropriate "all risks" insurance for their exhibit(s).

AWARDS

The Society will not be responsible for awards or prize money not received by Exhibitors after 31 December 2024. If you have not received your award(s) or prize money by 30 November 2024 please contact RASWA on (08) 6263 3100.

SOCIETY'S LIABILITY

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Show Regulation 17, with reference to the Society's Liability.
